## PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Second Annual Symposium on Cutaneous Lymphomas will review the most recent data on diagnosing cutaneous lymphoma based on the WHO/EORTC consensus classification along with providing the most common subtypes of cutaneous lymphomas. The conference is a forum for experts to discuss the approved and investigational agents and modalities used to treat patients with this disease. The conference is structured to provide the opportunity to interact with the faculty and each other.
